A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I write this in the wake of learning about another horrible act of terrorism in a mall in Nairobi, Kenya on the eve of the gathering of world leaders at the United Nations.

The U.N. was founded in 1945 after World War II to promote international cooperation in the pursuit of lasting world peace. In a world that struggles towards achieving that goal of living in peace, the Church is called to be a light of unity and peace so others can see what is envisioned by God for the church.

Jesus prayed that his disciples "be brought to complete unity." Jesus asked others to follow Him so that the world would know that God sent Christ as a gift - not to condemn the world but to heal and transform it. As reminder of that call, on October 6, we will observe World Communion Sunday where Christians around the world join in partaking of the elements of bread and wine in remembrance of Jesus.

As the Church strives to make peace the true reality for the world, we live out Christ's command to "love the Lord with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27)

Join us as we come together in the sure and certain hope that in a broken world, God enters in with the light and love of Christ to save us and lead us to His peace

As John Bestenheider said in worship last Sunday - blessed are the peacemakers. This was one of Jesus' favorite sayings. Let us pray and work for peace.

CHURCH GARAGE SALE






Adult Sunday School






Church Ladies




Financial Report for September


