


"How Do I Join Cornerstone Presbyterian Church?"

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FOR OCTOBER:

The Session met on Saturday, October 8, with Rev. Courtney B. Cromie moderating the meeting. Nine elders were in attendance with three absent. Also a Session Retreat was held prior to the meeting with Dan Raisch invited as a guest speaker. During the Session Meeting and the Retreat, the following items were discussed and/or action taken:

- The Session discussed and prayed over what the priorities for Cornerstone Presbyterian Session and Membership should be for 2011-2012. The Session approved the circle chart of priorities included in this newsletter (see below)
- The Session discussed and reviewed the job description for the pastor as approved by the Nominating Committee
- The Session received a report from the Nominating Committee including a reminder for the Congregational Meeting on October 23 and confirmation that a complete nominee slate had been secured. The Session offered up gratitude to the committee for their hard work.
- The Session agreed of the need for a building committee to meet soon for the purpose of discussing options for going forward with building plans and addressing office needs.
- The Session voted to decide upon a process for examination and training for incoming elders at the November Session Meeting.
- The Session did vote to have Reverend Cromie speak to pastor Joe Tiedeman at Jackson Methodist regarding a way for gratitude to be expressed to the Jackson Methodist congregation for the use of their facility for the Installation Service on October 2.
- Moderator Cromie reported that she would be away for a wedding the weekend of October 16th and that she was grateful for the wonderful day of Installation with reception on October 2. She also reported that there was a need for approval for a possible fee structure associated with one-time online donations to be linked to the church website. The session approved the possible fee structure. Moderator Cromie also reported a need for a Missions and Evangelism Committee and a New Members' Class should be held sometime in November.



Please continue to keep Cornerstone Presbyterian in prayer as we continue to be in transition with a new pastor and a new music minister as well as for Cornerstone to focus on the new priorities voted on by session for this next year.

Then, on November 13, we will resume the series by hearing a message on the Gift of Talent and then we will close the series with a November 20 Stewardship Sunday Sermon on the Gift of Treasure. Stewardship is not just about sharing our financial resources but about a way to contemplate God's gifts to us and to consider a prayerful way to be good stewards of those resources. Cornerstone Confirmation Class Starting in February 2012

Confirmation Class for High School Youth in 9th grade and above will be offered from February – May 2012. This class is a time for youth to confirm the love that God has expressed for each of us in Jesus Christ. It is important that both the youth and the family are involved in this journey.

On **Sunday**, **January 29**th **from 11 -11:30 AM**, there will be an informational meeting in which youth and parents are invited to learn more about the Confirmation Process here at Cornerstone Presbyterian. Adult Classes

Children and Youth in Mission




