

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FOR NOVEMBER:

- -The session received an update from the Worship Committee announcing details for Christmas Services and a date for Installation/Ordination of officers (December 18). It was highlighted that there will be a joint Christmas Day Service with Jackson Methodist Church at 10 AM. In addition, the Worship Committee encouraged members/friends of Cornerstone to attend the Community Thanksgiving Service at Hope Cathedral at 7 PM, November 20. It was announced that our children will be singing and ringing bells with Debows Wesley Club.
- An update was received from Elder Joan Mallison regarding a successful Shoe Box Mission Opportunity. A total of 87 boxes were collected and 37 will be given to local Jackson residents and the remainder will be sent to Samaritan's Purse and distributed to children in difficult circumstances around our world.
- -The Session reviewed the Priorities for 2012 and discussed where in our ministries are we focusing on these goals. Prayers are requested for how Cornerstone can continue to be faithful in these areas.
- -It was reported that several donations were received to cover the cost of computer equipment and needs for staff and worship.
- -The session agreed to a book study in January on discerning our spiritual gifts for leadership.
- -The session voted on details for examination of elders where the examination of incoming elders will take place in a reading of materials and a sharing of faith journeys at the December session meeting.
- -The December Session Meeting will include a Christmas dinner and White Elephant as well as recognition of outgoing elders and welcoming and examining of new elders.
- -The Finance Committee did report that if all pledges were received in December that there should be a balanced budget for 2011.


Cornerstone Children's Ministry & The DeBows Wesley Club

PLEDGE FOR 2012



We celebrated Stewardship Sunday on November 20th. It was the end of a 5-week series on stewardship, including sermons on the gifts of time, faith, talent and treasure, and featuring 11 testimonies from individuals who shared what Cornerstone and their faith mean to them. On Stewardship Sunday, members and friends were invited to pledge their time, talents and treasure for 2012. To date, we have Stewardship received 29 pledges—it's not too late! If you would like to pledge, please download the forms and mail them or bring them to church.

Per Capita

Perhaps one of the most confusing aspects of how the Presbyterian Church functions is "per-capita". Each year our church encourages its members to pay their per-capita apportionment. Why do we do this? Where does this money go? One of the great strengths of our denomination is its connectionism. We who worship at Cornerstone are tied to the larger church in ministry. One concrete form of that connection is through our per-capita. Every Presbyterian church in the country is required to pay a certain amount for each active member on its rolls. This money goes to support the work and ministry of our church throughout the country. Each governing body above the Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the church. Unlike pastors, these individuals have no congregation to support their ministry. Although their ministry may not be as "glamorous" as missionary work in South America, they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church. These are the people who prepare the curriculum that our children use, the offering materials that we receive, and countless other resources. For the year 2011, our per-capita apportionment is \$35.00, which is split for the work of the Presbytery of Monmouth, the Synod of Northeast and our General Assembly. Many people view per-capita as their "membership dues" to the church. This is not true. The church is not like a fraternal or service organization that will dismiss their members for unpaid dues. Yes, the church is required to pay its per-capita to the large church. Many congregations encourage their members to help by inviting them to pay their own per-capita along with their regular giving. If members of the church are unwilling or unable to pay, then the hope is that other members might give more than their own per capita to help offset the cost for others. Consider per-capita not as your dues to be paid to the church, but rather as a form of mission giving to the larger work of the Presbyterian Church. As of today, Cornerstone's Per Capita is \$5880 for 2011 and only \$700 has been paid to date. If you are willing to help Cornerstone to be current with our Per Capita, please note in the memo of your check that money should be used towards Per Capita or write on an envelope "Per Capita" with a cash donation. See Pastor Courtney or Faron Trick, Chair of our Finance Committee, for more information.
