Message from our Pastor

Greetings, Friends and Members of Cornerstone!

Sunday, April 1st is the day that many Christians observe and remember a day long ago when Jesus was triumphantly welcomed into Jerusalem. Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week and recalls the day that Jesus was greeted with Hosannas and welcomed with palm branches. Soon after this time of celebration, though, we are somberly reminded of the rest of the story. On Maundy Thursday, we are taken back into the time in Jesus' life when he had his Last Supper with his closest friends and relayed to them his commandment to "Remember." His arrest happens soon after and then we are taken to Good Friday where Jesus, our Savior, was crucified. As Holy week comes to a close, we then think on Jesus in the tomb. What would our lives be like if that was the end of the story? But, alas - Easter arrives and we are called upon to celebrate the empty tomb and the resurrection of our Lord! For Christians, this week is full of emotion and passion. It is often called Jesus' Passion. And, as we think on Jesus' suffering and on the difficult emotional journey he pursued during this week, we take to heart how Jesus died for us and of what He endured in His love for us. I encourage each of you as we enter into Holy Week to look with hope towards the gift of Easter. And as we anxiously await the Good News, we must also allow ourselves time to be faithful in remembrance of Jesus' passion through the events of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We should fall on our knees in thanksgiving for the love and forgiveness found in Christ's sacrifice and in Christ's suffering for us. We are called to be faithful as we enter the joy of Easter and to respond with passion so that our lives might allow Christ's light to illumine others in the hope and knowledge of eternal life found in the Good News of Easter. Let's be passionate!


The Days of Holy Week




Palm Sunday is the specific day when we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Many churches reenact Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on this Sunday during the season of Lent. This practice can be traced back to the fourth century in the city of Jerusalem. During this procession, participants carry palms and other branches into the church. The church becomes a symbol of the city of Jerusalem. After the procession with palms, the worship service that follows becomes more somber as Holy Week begins.

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday that occurs during Holy Week. The emphasis for this Thursday is on Jesus' new commandment of love: "Love one another even as I have loved you." The word "maundy"

comes from the English form of the Latin *mandatum*, which means commandment. Maundy Thursday is a combination of three things—a time to commemorate the Last Supper, a time when penitents are reconciled to the family of believers, and a time to prepare for Baptism. It is also a time when the discipline of Lent is concluded with forgiveness. Jesus' new commandment to his disciples, "Love one another even as I have loved you," contrasts sharply with Judas' betrayal at the completion of the Last Supper. Jesus' love for all people is demonstrated by



his service to others, as well as in his gift of himself for our salvation. The washing of the disciples' feet as part of the Last Supper was a concrete example of the loving service Jesus shared with his followers. Foot washing is often a part of Maundy Thursday celebrations today, as a response to the new commandment and as a symbol of Christian charity and service.



Good Friday, the Friday during Holy Week, became widely kept as a commemoration of the cross by the end of the fourth century. On Good Friday, we emphasize a time of reflection, intercession, and adoration of Christ as the sacrificial lamb. Like many churches, we commemorate Good Friday with a Tenebrae service, remembering the last night of Jesus' life and the betrayals and trials he suffered, using the symbol of increasing darkness. This form of worship dates from the seventh century and has been named "tenebrae," a word meaning "darkness" or "shadows."

Cornerstone Presbyterian Session Minute's Summary, March 2012

- *The Session extended their gratitude to the members of the Finance Committee for their hard work, including the Treasurer, Gordon Connelly, and Chair of Finance, Faron Trick. Dominique Robert has agreed to take over as finance chair in May.
- *The March Finance report includes the 19,110 that has came in from donations from an appeal later that Pastor Courtney sent to friends and family. In addition, a member gave an anonymous donation towards the cost of a youth seminary intern for Summer 2012.
- *The Finance Committee will meet on Sunday, April 1 to discuss 3 options for investment options for existing resources.
- *Pastor Courtney during the time of devotion asked elders to consider five reasons why Cornerstone is a church they love. In addition, she asked them to brainstorm how we might share these things with others. Some ideas were shared including: Pastor brunches, Bring a Friend Day for Young People; Words of Encouragement from the Pastor/ Members for people to be faithful in worship attendance. In addition, Courtney shared that she would like help and assistance from the elders in bringing in new members and guests to services and programs.
- *A Worship Committee Update included the request from Todd Moyer for each elder to take at least one Sunday a year to prepare the communion elements and to help with communion set-up. Joan Mallison has stepped down after many years of faithful service. Elders agreed to signing up to prepare and set-up communion over the next months. Todd is organizing a chart. Pastor Cromie reported that Want-Ads have been posted for a new Music Minister since Christine Tegeder's time with us comes to a close the first week of June. Suggestions were requested in how to find a replacement and elders recommended contacting clerks of area presbyteries and the Jackson school music teachers.
- *In the Pastor Report, Courtney shared that two Seminary Students will join us from Princeton Seminary this summer. An anonymous gift will pay for one and the other will be funded by Princeton Seminary. There could be up to three seminary students in the fall.
- *Revision to approved Terms of Call The session discussed how pastor benefits should be revised to combine study leave and automobile expenses as was communicated to Presbytery. This was passed and the pastor's terms of call should include a combined \$6,700 for other professional expenses.
- *Two Elders should attend the March 27th Presbytery Meeting. 7 p.m. at the First Presbyterian Church of Bordentown, 420 Farnsworth Ave, Bordentown, NJ 08505. Kellie Pushko and Todd Moyer will check their schedules to see if they could attend.
- * The session voted to create a Deacon's Assistance Fund in the budget as requested by the church ladies where the pastor could access these monies for those in need who request assistance. The church ladies have agreed to donate \$100 from fundraisers to start this fund. One Sunday per year a special offering will be held for donations to this fund. The Deacon's Fund was approved.
- * It was reported that the Choir is interested in hosting a Talent Show/Private Auction Fundraiser. They need affordable space to hold the event. Elders shared ideas for location for any upcoming fundraisers to include: Fire Halls, Hope Chapel, Amvets, etc. One elder said that perhaps a portion of the Shop Rite card profit could go to this fund instead of Building Fund. Another elder said that the pastor and others should encourage the purchase of shop-rite gift cards as gifts to those in need and others.
- * It was reported that there will be a relocation to Jackson Liberty High School for Summer 2012 to begin July 1 until August 26.
- * The next session meeting will be held at the home of Todd Moyer on Monday, April 23 at 7 PM Important dates in May:

Monday, May 14th - Call for a Special Session Meeting for the purpose of hearing the faith statements from our confirmation youth and voting to receive them into membership. This will be a "Pot-Luck" Dinner held at the home of the Welch Family;

Friday, May 18th - Spring Retreat & Short Session Meeting - 6:30 p.m. - 9 p.m. - place to be announced.


Women's Bible Study




Church Ladies
