ABOUT THE SEASON OF ADVENT Preparing Our Hearts For The Christchild

Advent is a season of anticipation and hope. During these December days we look forward with great excitement to celebrate the birth of baby Jesus. We're leaning forward during Advent, looking ahead, hoping, anticipating.

The Advent wreath points our attention forward to Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. (John 8:12) These December days (in the northern hemisphere) are days of increasing darkness. The days are shorter and shorter, the nights are longer and longer. The candles of the Advent wreath bring increasing light as we light another candle each Sunday. LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION FROM THE CORNERSTONE SESSION REGARDING THE *PASTOR EMERITUS* STATUS OF REVEREND ROBERT MORRISON

December 1, 2012

Dear Members,

CORNERSTONE COMMUNITY

One way for a congregation to honor a former pastor is to confer the status of pastor emeritus. When Reverend Robert "Rev. Rob" Morrison retired it was the expressed wish of the congregation to confer upon him the status of Pastor Emeritus of Cornerstone Presbyterian Church. Pastor emeritus is defined in the Book of Order prior to 2011 the following way:

"When any pastor or associate pastor retires, and the congregation is moved with affection and gratitude to continue an association in an honorary relationship, it may, at a regularly called congregational meeting, elect him or her as pastor emeritus or emerita, with or without honorarium, but with no pastoral authority or duty. This action shall be taken only after consultation with the committee on ministry of the presbytery concerning the wisdom of this relationship for the peace of the church. This action shall be subject to the approval of the presbytery, and may take effect upon the formal dissolution of the pastoral or associate pastoral relationship or anytime thereafter."

During Rev. Rob's retirement celebration on November 17, 2010 a motion was made stating that in gratitude for Reverend Dr. Robert Morrison's service to Cornerstone Presbyterian Church it be recommended to Presbytery that the title of "Pastor Emeritus" be conferred upon him. Although the congregation voted unanimously to approve the motion, the congregation was asked to wait at least one (1) year, as is customary within our presbytery, and revisit the honor at that time.

The necessary time has passed and the Session has reopened consultations with our Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM). In entering into consultation with the COM, the Session will now fulfill the expressed wishes of the congregation. The Session would also like to remind the Cornerstone community that the designation of pastor emeritus is an honorary relationship with "no pastoral authority or duty."

The COM and presbytery have now given their blessing to Cornerstone at the most recent Presbytery Meeting and the most recent COM meeting and we can now go forward and arrange for a worship service or other event to celebrate the occasion of this honorary relationship. This letter is meant to remind the congregation of the honor we have conferred upon Rev. Rob as well as to educate and be absolutely clear to the congregation about the role of a retired pastor (and pastor emeritus). It is extremely important that the congregation understand the role of the retired pastor, especially when the honor of pastor emeritus will allow the retired pastor to occasionally attend church services and events.

This then leads to some practical questions:

What are the ethical guidelines for a retired pastor?

A retired pastor is no longer available to do the things they used to do--especially weddings, baptisms, and funerals. Close friends, of the retired pastor, from the congregation will need to get used to the fact that any conversations should exclude discussions of the current pastor and congregational life.

A retired pastor who remains in the community <u>must</u> worship somewhere else and <u>must</u> say "NO" when parishioners call for advice, complain about congregational life, or ask him to perform weddings, baptisms or funerals.

Does the pastor emeritus relationship change the responsibilities dictated by the ethical guidelines for retired pastors?

No! The guidelines for retired pastors are to be followed by all pastors. If anything, the pastor emeritus has increased responsibility to follow and interpret the ethics guidelines to the members of the congregation who may misunderstand the relationship and assume a continuing pastoral relationship.

The only changes are that a pastor emeritus can <u>occasionally</u> attend, as a guest, services or events of the church or congregation and can be enlisted to perform activities within the church, <u>but</u> only with the express invitation of the session and approval from the presbytery.

The Session has moved forward to faithfully carry out the expressed wishes of the congregation and extend appreciation and honor to Cornerstone's founding pastor. A celebration will be arranged at a convenient time for Rob and Kathe in early 2013.

Dr. John Markel graduated from seminary and then in 2002, he was installed as organizing pastor of Tappahannock Presbyterian Chapel in Tappahannock, Virginia. Next, John served as Pastor at Bethesda Presbyterian in northeast Philadelphia March 2004 until he officially retired on Sunday, October 7, 2012. John was a dentist before becoming a pastor.


Thanks to all who helped with Operation Christmas Child!

Stewardship Update


Each week in worship we are sharing our thanks and challenges to pledge and give generously. In spite of the economy, God has blessed us at Cornerstone. How do we say thanks? We offer up our weekly tithes and offerings as we are able. Commitment is vital for the future of Cornerstone. We need your regular support of our ministry.


Cornerstone has about 70 potential giving units. To date, 22 have pledged (thank you!). Last year we had 42 pledges or about 60% of the potential giving units (families). We hope to have 48 pledges this year (we had 50 in 2010) and have about 45% of the expected pledges so far. Over 60 % of the pledges are increased over last year and as a result we have achieved over 70% of last years pledge total. Our goal is to increase last years total by 15%. If we can do that, we can finally present a balanced budget. We are on target to meet that goal but we need the support of the congregation to get their pledges in with the hope that they can increase their pledge and help us meet our goal.
