A MESSAGE FROM OUR SEMINARY INTERN, KONNIE CLARY

The Season of Lent

As we begin the season of Lent, we must remember to prepare. The sermon last Sunday was about preparing: our minds for change, our hearts for transformation, and our spirits for new life. As we approach Easter, we approach resurrection and new life. It is with this hope in mind that the season of Lent can be a time of preparation.

Kathy Genus reminded us in the last newsletter that Lent can be a time to prepare by "doing something" instead of "giving something up." So often we hear about people giving up their favorite food or beverage for Lent, but what Kathy highlighted is the reformed thinking of doing something to strengthen and bolster our faith, rather than sacrificing something, or even in addition to sacrificing something.

Lent is not a time to create "New Year's Resolutions," that can only be held onto for forty days. It is a time to transform and to change, inviting in new life—life in Christ. Lent is a time where we may give something up, or join a group to worshipfully study the word in community, or dedicate time each day to prayer, or decide to read through the New Testament; but it is a time when we do so in order to prepare our hearts to receive the gift of life in Christ. This means that after the forty days are up, perhaps we don't stop. Maybe we continue on with whatever we did that has transformed us. Through the course of Lent, if we allow the things we take on to transform our hearts and minds, we invite in a new mentality that can be extremely life-giving.

A few years back, I gave up coffee for Lent. It was challenging at best, for a person who drinks several cups a day. But what I learned that year was not so much about God; it didn't deepen my faith so much as simply teach me self-control. Certainly it was beneficial for me to do this exercise; and for some people this type of sacrifice is beneficial and does help build faith. But it was a different year that I chose to "do something" that really affected me deeply.

Another year I decided to read through the New Testament during the Lenten season. I figured that if Lent was a time of preparation for new life in Christ, what better time is there to read through the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Christ. That year Lent was overwhelmingly meaningful. My faith, which had become stagnant over the years, took on a new vibrancy and I grew and changed much through that experience.

Shortly after Lent that year, I experienced a major time of grief. Looking back, I realized that God carried me through that time, and helped me to prepare for that with a stronger faith and a deeper reliance on Him. Lent was more than a time of intentional focus on my spiritual walk. It was a time of preparation and a time of hopeful waiting that ended up transforming me deeply and carrying me through some difficult times.

Though this is just one story, I hope that you have experienced something similar through Lent. And I hope we are able to experience this year what God can do in and through our lives by dedicating a short season to doing something for the Lord.

Rev. Cromie preached at Rev. Courtney Cromie's Installation Service in October 2011 and was a generous supporter of Cornerstone.

Minister's faith inspired others to follow path, Published: Friday, February 15, 2013

The Rev. Dick Cromie made God's work come to life in many ways.

The Rev. Cromie could give just a look, word or prayer and alter the course of a person's life forever, family and friends said. "As a youngster growing up in Mt. Lebanon, I attended Southminster Presbyterian Church with my family, where I heard Dr. Cromie preach," said the Rev. James Tinnemeyer Jr., senior pastor of Shadyside Presbyterian Church. "He was someone to look up to. And

it was from his dedication in serving others that I answered a call to the ministry."

The Rev. Dr. Richard Marlin Cromie of Matthews, N.C., formerly of Pittsburgh and a former moderator of the Pittsburgh Presbytery, died on Saturday, Feb. 9, 2013, in Carolinas Medical Center-Mercy. He was 76.

He inspired his daughter, Courtney B. Cromie, to follow in his footsteps. On Oct. 2, 2011, she was installed as the pastor of Cornerstone Presbyterian Church in Jackson, N.J. Born and raised in Pittsburgh, the Rev. Cromie was one of four children of Harry Marlin Cromie and Margaret Acker Cromie.

After graduating from the University of Pittsburgh and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, the Rev. Cromie received his doctorate from the University of St. Andrews in Scotland, and in 1981 his Doctor of Divinity from Grove City College.

The Rev. Cromie was always true to his Scottish heritage. On St. Andrew's Day, which honors the patron saint of Scotland, he preached attired in a kilt.

Before his retirement in 2004, Cromie served pastorates in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Mt. Lebanon and McCandless, as well as the University of Pittsburgh and Carnegie Mellon University. He is survived by his wife, Margaret Good Cromie; daughters, Catherine C. DeCramer of Charlotte, Anne C. Cromie of Gainesville, Fla., and the Rev. Courtney B. Cromie of Jackson, N.J.; his sister, Alice Williams of Pittsburgh; and two grandchildren, Madeline and William. He was preceded in death by his sister, Carol Williams, and his brother, Robert.

This spring, the **elementary** children will be learning from the We Believe Spring 2013 curriculum called "We Worship in the Spirit." The spring quarter begins with the continuation of the Lenten unit on the elements of worship, followed by the Palm Sunday, Passion, and Easter narrative. A unit on the Lord's Supper, both in its biblical context

and as our sacrament today, is studied. The theme of worship is continued with sessions on affirmations of faith and commissioning to serve. The quarter concludes with sessions on Pentecost and the new church community.

The Middle School Class has started a New Testament curriculum on "The Parables."

Lessons include: Parables of the Kingdom (3 lessons), Parables of Forgiveness, Parables of the Love of One's Neighbor, Parables of Praying, Parables of Self-Righteousness and Humility, Parables of the Cost of Discipleship, Parables of the Invitation of God, Parables of Repentance, Parables of the Importance of Preparing for the Future, Parables of Individual Responsibility.





Per Capita


