A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

"A New Season of Transition for Cornerstone"

One of the reasons I love living in New Jersey is the opportunity to experience and enjoy all four seasons of weather, Summer, Fall, Winter, and Spring. Each season transitions to the next giving us time to anticipate and to prepare for the change. When it comes time for the season to change again, most of us are usually ready to welcome the next season. Church Sunday School So what? Now what?

Robert Raikes (1735-1811) is considered to be "Mr. Sunday School." Raikes was a reformer who noticed that children of working-class parents were not getting an education. Many of them were joining their parents at work six days a week!

In 1780, he set up a Sunday school in Gloucester, England where these children could learn to read and write with the Bible as their textbook. The Sunday school movement spread rapidly to the United States and all over the world.

The world of our children is very different from the world of the 19th century. What does our approach to children's ministries look like now?

Cornerstone's Children's Ministry is designed to meet the needs of children with a wide mixture of activities and fun. It encourages intergenerational involvement to expose children to many different role models. It reaches outside the classroom to connect children and the church by technology and field trips. Our children are offered a secure classroom where questions are encouraged and answers are explored together.

Although children and cultural realities have changed over time, some of their basic human needs have not. Children still need someone to care and someone to tell them the truth in a way that speaks to them. Jesus taught people like this.

Our Children's Ministry and our Church Sunday school provides opportunities to help others. We hope that children who come to Cornerstone will hear and be part of the most beautiful story in the world and will want to pass it on.

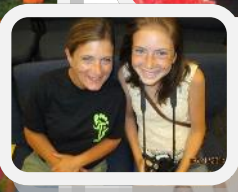

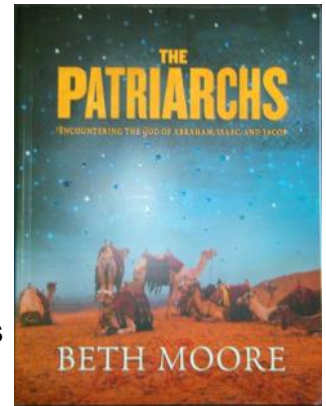

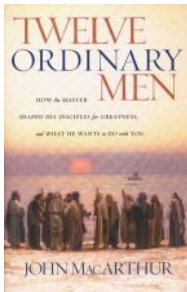
Women's Tuesday Morning Bible Study

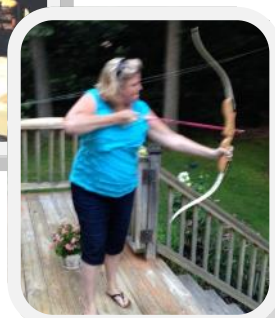
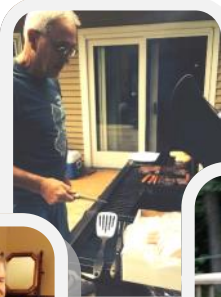
ADULT BOOK STUDY—Resuming on Monday, September 22nd
