Update on Harmony Road

Much progress has been made this past month in the renovations at Harmony Road! Spackling of the walls is finished and the interior painting of the sanctuary is completed. The carpeting has been ordered and will be installed mid-November. The septic system should be completed any day, and we are currently securing permits to install a handicap ramp. Felt pads have been placed on pews. There are several jobs that will be undertaken at our work day on 11/1 (see pg. 5 for more info).

The major jobs that remain are as follows: 1) Finish septic system 2) Install pump for well and test water 3) Excavate area for parking lot

- 4) Build handicap ramp
- 5) Pave handicap parking area
- 6) Install carpeting
- 7) Finish plumbing connections to well and septic
- 8) Add gravel to parking area
- 9) Do masonry work for steps to porch
- 10) Move trailer to end of current parking lot
- 11) Grease and repair bell
- 12) Install front doors
- 13) Install storm windows and repair altar side windows
- 14) Lower wall in front of choir loft

Praise God, there is light at the end of the tunnel! Thank you to Bruce Thompson and to everyone who has helped along the way!





What is a Deacon?



The information below is taken from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Book of Order 2013-2015. If you feel called to serve as a Deacon, please talk to Gail Carlson, chairperson of the Cornerstone Nominating Committee.

G-2.02 DEACONS: THE MINISTRY OF COMPASSION AND SERVICE G-2.0201 Deacon Defined The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress . Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry.

G-2.0202 Under Authority of the Session Deacons may be individually commissioned or organized as a board of deacons. In either case, their ministry is under the supervision and authority of the session. Deacons may also be given special assignments in the congregation, such as caring for members in need, handling educational tasks, cultivating liberality in giving, collecting and disbursing monies to specific persons or causes, or overseeing the buildings and property of the congregation. Deacons shall assume other duties as may be delegated to them by the session, including assisting with the Lord's Supper. (W-3.3616). A congregation by a majority vote may choose not to utilize the ordered ministry of deacons. If the congregation has neither a board of deacons nor individually commissioned deacons, the function of this ordered ministry shall be the responsibility of the ruling elders and the session.

Community Thanksgiving Service


November 22, 2014


Newark Boys Chorus 12/9

All Women Welcome!





Description: Traveling pilgrims sang these psalms both on the way to the great festivals of the LORD and as key elements of the worship at those festivals. Just as a song or poem can express feelings of fear, doubt, hope, and joy, these 15 psalms model how we can voice our own petitions and praises to our God, who is always available and ready to hear us.

Explore the major feasts of Israel and journey with Beth through this 7session study. Themes of unity, joy, gratitude, redemption, repentance, the power of blessings, facing ridicule, and more are explored in detail. Modern-day believers in Jesus Christ can learn much from these treasured Psalms in their journey toward greater intimacy with God.

ADULT BIBLE STUDY


The Adult Bible Study meets on Thursdays from 6:30-8 PM at the home of Bob



Sunday School resumed for kids during worship! The kids enjoyed a photo scavenger hunt











We were blessed on October 4th to hear Vikki Leach sing "Amazing Grace" and to have guest Will Vanderburg fill in for us while Susan was away.






