In addition, there is a work day scheduled for

Saturday, August 13th, starting at 9 AM. For all who are able to stay into the afternoon, a scrumptious lunch will be provided! ALL help is welcome—please come if you can!

A partial list of tasks for the day:

- 1) Finish painting interior of church (mostly trim)
- 2) Scrape excess paint off windows in added rooms
- 3) Install cove molding in restroom and storage room
- 4) Install railing at left front of church
- 5) Dig out beds for landscaping
- 6) Install storm windows on both sides of church
- 7) Extend downspout at left rear of church
- 8) Inspect, repair and clean pews as necessary
- 9) Clean restroom; install paper towels
- 10) Discuss mirror option in restroom
- 11) Set up storage area in basement as available.
- 12) Inspect storage shed at school
- 13) Remove gate at left rear of church and move to right, if possible
- 14) Repair side of bilco door entrance.
- 15) Paint black heating grates.

John Ortberg invites us to consider the incredible potential that awaits us outside our comfort zone. Out on the risky waters of faith, Jesus is waiting to meet you and I in ways that



The Tuesday morning Women's Bible Study is taking a break for the summer and will resume in September!




The Tuesday morning Women's Bible Study is tentatively planning to study "The Call," a study on the Apostle Paul, starting in September. Stay tuned for details!
