### A Message from Pastor Tory

This year for me personally has been a year of waiting. Waiting for my first grandson to arrive, waiting for my oldest daughter to be married, and waiting to have my shoulder replaced. Two of my waits are over, but the wait for surgery seems to be never ending. Just as I was about to have surgery, I had a freak accident with my puppy. My puppy, who weighs 106 pounds, jumped and came down on my leg, taking a large area of skin. Now I go to the wound care doctor each week waiting for the surgeon to give the okay. Waiting is tough, yet can also help us to become more reliant on God. To trust that his time is the best time. Something I do not have to tell you, the members of Cornerstone, who have been waiting for years and years for a church home, yet I have witnessed such deep faith and tremendous trust in God.

One of our family's favorite Disney movies is "Toy Story". Lightyear believes he is a "real" Space Ranger and is able to fly. He proves it to all the toys in Andy's room except for Woody, who says, "that's not flying, it is falling with style!". As humans we have wondered about flying since the beginning of time. As we watched the birds soar we have wondered how? How could these simple creatures, these "bird brains," do something so astounding as fly and we could not? Eventually the science of physics deduced that "flying" occurred because birds have hollow bones, so they carry very little weight for their size and they have large, hinged wings that can give them maximum airflow for their size — whether they are a dove or an eagle. But fundamentally, there are three different ways birds manage to fly. Either they "flap," or they "glide," or they "soar." Flapping takes the most energy. It is the most complicated and the most difficult of all flying procedures. But all birds, regardless of their size and abilities, have to "flap" sometimes. But flapping is hard work. Gliding is another form of flying. Gliding takes advantage of the laws of aerodynamics. The bird's wing is pushed up from below as it is pulled up from above — making a "glide" possible. But the ultimate "flying-without-effort" is achieved by those birds who have learned to "soar." Soaring uses the aerodynamics of gliding but combines it with the science of meteorology. If you have ever admired hawks or eagles effortlessly

wheeling high up in the air, you have seen the power of soaring. These largest, heaviest, birds combine the breadth of their impressive wingspans with their ability to use "thermals", columns of warm air that rise. The warmed air of the thermal lifts the bird and allows it to "ride the wave" without having to expend any of its own energy.

As we "Wait" for the move into the Harmony Road Church building we are like birds in flight. Sometimes we have had to flap. As you know it has taken **lots** of energy, and hard work just to stay aloft. Over the years it has meant securing a building to worship in, and volunteers to set up and take down the worship space each week. There was a lot of flapping and a little gliding through the years of waiting. Finally, God showed Cornerstone the promised land, Harmony Road. However, before we could inhabit the land there was much more flapping. There were permits and approvals to seek, recruitment and coordination of many volunteer workers as well as the contractors to schedule. The result has required a lot of patience and a lot of prayer especially when our patience wavered. Cornerstone has indeed had to flap hard to take flight, to flap hard, even against the fiercest winds of opposition. Sometimes it may have seemed as though we were "falling with style". Yet our faith was renewed by our Lord, giving the lift and thrust needed to keep us aloft. We have waited faithfully and grown in grace as a family of faith. Our waiting at times has kept us flapping and there have been episodes of gliding but the greatest waiting we can embrace is the wait that allows us to soar.

Almost nothing is more impressive than a soaring eagle. Seemingly without effort, these creatures wheel and swoop, linger, and float effortlessly. Soaring requires trusting in something beyond physical dynamics. Soaring is not so much about skeletal structure or wing to body ratios as it is about **Trust**. As we are eagerly preparing to enter Harmony Road Church building, "the promised land". Now is the time for each member of Cornerstone to listen to how God is calling them to be ready to serve, support and pray for this amazing blessing from God. With the Lord's guidance and love we are going to soar! Ready to be a beacon of faith and hope for our neighbors, welcoming those who need a place to belong. Let us pray that our Lord will lift us to new heights as we worship and praise him, as we soar trusting in the power of his never failing love! May we learned to live on the faithful promise of Isaiah:

"Those who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up on wings as eagles; weary, they shall walk and not faint."

Nicholas Hughes graduated from MATES and will be heading to Northeastern University in the fall to study Computer Science and Computer Engineering.








### The Cornerstone Choir rehearses before worship on Sundays at 9:00 AM.
