A Message from Pastor Tory

On Thursday evening, I will join with fellow clergy and members of the Jackson community to lift our voices in prayer for our nation. I invite you to join us at the Jackson Municipal Building this Thursday, May 4th, at 7pm.

The National Day of Prayer has great significance for us as a nation as it enables us to recall and to teach the way in which our founding fathers sought the wisdom of God when faced with critical decisions. It stands as a call for us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people. The unanimous passage of the bill establishing the National Day of Prayer as an annual event, signifies that prayer is as important to our nation today as it was in the beginning.

Prayer is central to our faith. Yet, in a busy high tech world it can seem less important than everything else we are doing. I believe when we keep our prayer life vital we find that God works through us in ways we would never have expected. I was reminded of this fact when Nick, my daughter's fiancé, gave me a sign he had found and thought of me. The sign says, "Prayer, the world's greatest wireless connection." The words ring true, long before our wireless world, God created an open line of communication. One that is never offline, unless, unfortunately we choose to go off. As I continued to look at this sign in my kitchen I found myself called to prepare a sermon series on prayer. I will be using the book called the "The Circle Maker" as a jumping off point. Mark Batterson, who wrote the book was inspired by the story of "Honi" which he found in the "Book of Legends," which is part of Jewish teachings passed down by generation to generation. Honi lived in the first century B.C. during a devastating drought. When it seemed as God was nowhere, Honi stilled dared to pray. (continued)

He drew a circle and prayed for rain. He would not budge until God answered his prayer and showed mercy to his children. Mark's reflections on prayer in the book "The Circle Maker" are both stirring and challenging. One illustration that inspires us to "re-connect" to God through prayer is the following, "There is nothing God loves more than keeping promises, answering prayers, performing miracles, and fulfilling big dreams. That is who He is. That is what He does. And the bigger the circle we draw, the better, because God gets more glory. The greatest moments in life are the miraculous moments when human impotence and divine omnipotence intersect - and they intersect when we draw a circle around the impossible situations in our lives and invite God to intervene." I am so looking forward to how this series on prayer may lead each of us to begin to draw prayer circles around our families, our jobs, our church, our community, our problems, and our dreams. Let us together commit to using "the greatest wireless connection" every day and rediscover the life-changing truth: God is there for YOU!

Why do we walk? Here is some information on poverty in Malawi:

- A population of 18.5 million people
- 1 million orphans
- Annual gross national income of \$650 per person
- Almost 50% of the population moderately or severely underweight
- Mother's mean age at first birth: 18
- 85% live as subsistence farmers
- Average life expectancy is 61
- 10% of the adult population living with HIV/AIDS.


Cornerstone has been assigned a vulnerable family in Malawithe family of Mai Sijaya Makawa. We ask our congregation to pray for them and keep them in mind as we walk.

Mai Sijaya Makawa is 44 years old and has 7 children. She has raised them on her own since her husband died in 2010. The only school going child is Mwaiwao – a girl aged 16 who is in standard 5. Mai Sijaya says she can't send the others to school because it is difficult for her to find money for good clothes, uniforms and other school materials. Apart from her children, she is also taking care of an 84 year old incontinent uncle who also suffers from bloody diarrhea.

In a normal year she harvests only 10 to 15 bags of maize, which lasts up to December. She has to do ganyu (day labor) to buy some food for the remaining 3 months. But because of the drought, last year she didn't harvest anything at all. She was only able to get by because of the irrigation project which was able to provide her and her family with green maize. Mai Sijaya wants to join the local VSL (Village Savings and Loan group) so that she can buy a new roof for her house. She says that before VIP came into the village she would just sit and wait, but now she knows that she can't do that anymore. She wants to use the new opportunities to work hard to provide her family with a better life.

The **youngest children** will also hear Bibles stories and have fun with our toys, as they are tenderly cared for by our nursery team!


