A Message from Pastor Tory

As I write this letter the hint of fall appears on the leaves. I love the colors of fall however it often signals the long winter ahead. I remember as a child on Labor Day my mother would say, "once Labor Day comes Christmas is right around the corner". To my mother those words bore a bit of dread. For me those words brought on feelings of great anticipation and excitement! Now as we receive our final permit to complete the parking lot of the Harmony Road Church, I feel that same feeling of anticipation and excitement. Since I came to serve as your Pastor, the Harmony Road church has been in the works. Every time we seem to be moving forward, a huddle or roadblock pops up. I have felt the frustration so many of you have been experiencing. To wait can be such a challenge. The people of God experienced waiting, the Bible is filled with accounts of marking time. Moses and the Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness before reaching the Promised Land. Joseph had to wait years before he was reunited and reconciled to his family. The prophets foresaw a time to come when the Messiah would come and they waited. Simeon and Anna were waiting for the Messiah well into their old age. Simeon was certain he would see the Messiah before he died. Tom Long writes of their waiting "Simeon and Anna were waiting for God to come, but they also were not passive in their waiting. Simeon was full of devotion and did what was just. Anna kept the lights burning at the Temple with her ceaseless worship. They waited, but, while they waited, they did what they could. Simeon and Anna did not wait because 'there was nothing else to do,' but because they had hope. Therefore, their waiting was not a vacuum, devoid of activity. 
Operation Christmas Child


The Cornerstone Choir rehearses before worship on Sundays at 9:00 AM.

The Tuesday morning Women's Bible Study meets on Tuesdays at 10:30 AM at the home of Elizabeth Hughes. The group is doing a 10-week study of the book "Ten Women of the Bible: One by One They Changed the World" by Max Lucado. It's never too late to join - please speak to Elizabeth for more information. Description: We don't even know all their names. Some are referred to only by their nationality. Some are known only by the place where they lived. Some would become queens, while others would live on the fringes of society. One would give birth to a nation, and one would give birth to the Messiah. Their culture often overlooked or discounted the contributions of women, yet the writers of Scripture found these women and the role they played remarkable to the telling of God's story.

As we study the lives of the women in the Bible, we find important truths that God wants us to grasp. They lived in a different world than our own, but we find ourselves facing the same issues they faced. Yet even more, these women show us there is a God who sees us where we are and loves us for who we are. He is the one who hovers over all the pages of the Bible, shaping lives, rescuing hearts, healing sicknesses, raising what was dead to life, and assigning high callings to those who choose to follow him and have faith in him.
