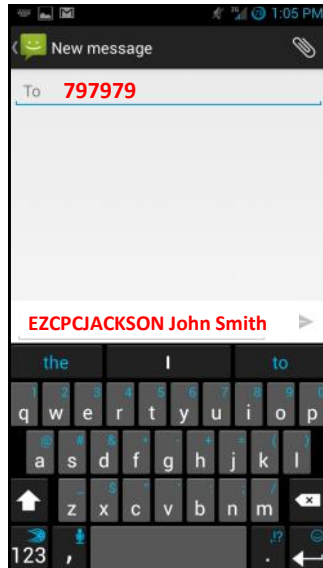

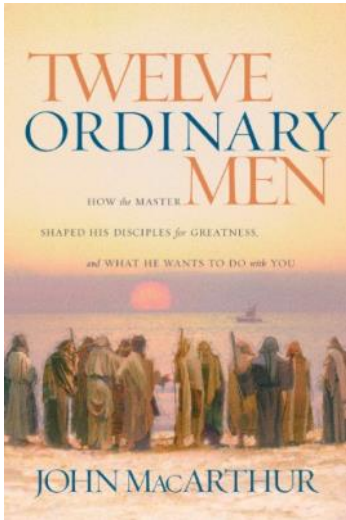


## Adult Bible Study

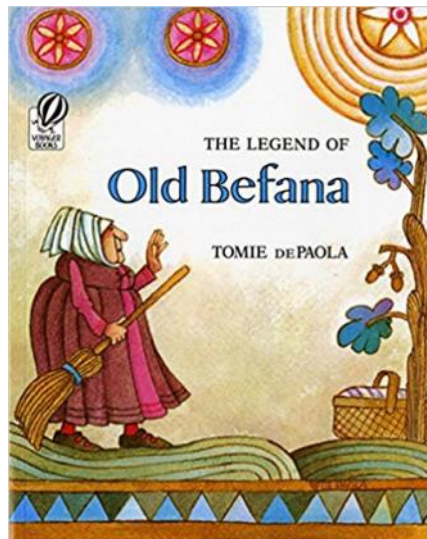
