A Message from Reverend Pruner



How often do we open our ShopRite circular and see an ad for “Lenten Favorites”? Yes, you can get some delicious Alaskan Cod for just \$6.99 per pound. Why is fish on sale especially? Many of you know the answer. There are Christians who during the Season of Lent give up meat on Fridays.

Lent has traditionally been a time of fasting, prayer, reflection, and study, leading up to the events of Holy Week. Lent is usually associated with giving up something, making some small personal sacrifice in order to better understand the immense sacrifice made by Jesus, the Son of God.

I would like to suggest that instead of “giving up” something for Lent that you “take on” something for Lent. The more we can take on during these few short weeks, the more opportunities we have to stretch ourselves. To grow more faithful as disciples. Lent can be a time for new possibilities and greater times of service and sharing of God’s love. What will you take on for these next few weeks?

Fritz Kreisler, the world-famous violinist (born 1875, died 1962), earned a fortune with his concerts and compositions. But he generously gave most of it away. So, when he discovered an exquisite violin on one of his trips, he couldn’t buy it. Later, having raised enough money to meet the asking price, he returned to the seller hoping to purchase that beautiful instrument. To his great dismay, it had been sold to an antique collector. Kreisler made his way to the new owner’s home and offered to buy the violin. The rare instrument was proudly displayed behind a sealed and solid glass case. Resting in its velvet couch, the violin lay imprisoned in its climate-controlled coffin. The collector said that it had become his prized possession, and he would not sell it.

Keenly disappointed, Kreisler was about to leave, when he had an idea. "Could I play the instrument once more before it's consigned to silence?" he asked. Permission was granted, and the great virtuoso released the violin from its fancy casket and filled the room with such heart-moving music that the collector's emotions were deeply stirred.

"I have no right to keep that to myself," the collector exclaimed. "It's yours, Mr. Kreisler. Take it into the world and let people hear it." God created you as an exquisite instrument. God designed you to make beautiful music.

You too are an "exquisite instrument" designed by God. May Lent allow us the opportunity to get our instrument off the self and get in tune. This could be the time to join the Bell Choir or The Sanctuary Choir. Serving as a member of our Ushering Guild once a month could be for you. Joining our Water Walk Team, raising awareness and funds for our partner churches in Malawi or coming to a spring clean-up day at the church might be the best way to exercise your instrument. Finally, you may want to join one of Bible Studies or support Sydney, a friend of the church, who is collecting good shoes for those in need as she works towards her Girl Scout Gold award.

May you prayerfully consider how you will "dust off your exquisite instrument in the weeks to come. I pray that this season of Lent lead us to the foot of the cross, bringing us to our knees in gratitude and awe at the love displayed so vividly on the cross by our Lord.

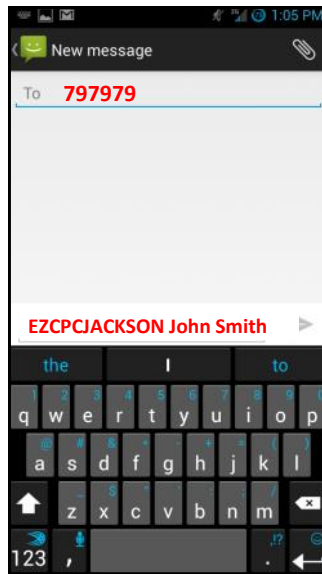
We once again have an opportunity to clean a Jackson road, and this time we can earn \$500 for our church!

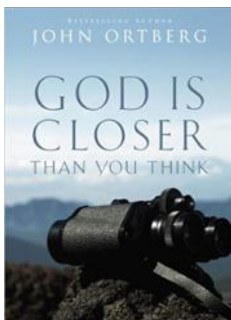

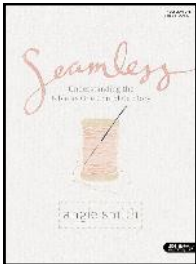
New Lenten Bible Study Starting March 2nd at Harmony House
