A Message from Reverend Pruner

I recently came upon story about Cecil B. DeMille, the famous motion picture producer. He was a man of great talents and insights. He often liked to go off by himself to think out a problem. One time, he was in a canoe on a lake in Maine. The whole afternoon he allowed the canoe to drift quietly while he thought about his problem.

The canoe drifted to a place where the water was only a few inches deep. Looking down he saw that the bottom was crowded with water beetles. As he watched, one of the beetles came to the surface and slowly crawled up the side of the canoe. Finally reaching the top, it grasped fast to the wood and died.

DeMille's thoughts went back to his problem. About three hours later he happened to notice the beetle again and saw that in the hot sun its shell had become dry and brittle. As he watched, it slowly split open, and there emerged from it a new form--a dragonfly--which took to the air out of the old husk, its scintillating colors flashing in the sunlight.

The winged insect flew further in an instant than a water beetle could crawl in days, and then it circled back and swooped down to the surface of the water. DeMille noticed its shadow on the water. The water beetles below might have seen it, too, but now their companion was in a world beyond their comprehension. They were still living in their limited beetle world, while their winged cousin had gained all the freedom between earth and sky.

Later, when DeMille told of this experience, he concluded with a very penetrating question: "Would the Great Creator of the universe do that for a water beetle, and not for a human being?" Imagine what God is going to do for his sons and daughters of faith who are heirs of the promises that Christ shared for those who believed in Him.

Cecil had one of those moments that our often called "God Sightings." As he witnessed the new life of the dragonfly and asked the great question "Would the Creator of the universe do that for a water beetle, and not for a human being?" The answer is a resounding "NO!"




Rehearsals for the **RINGERS AND SINGERS** began in March!
