

A Message from Reverend Pruner

As March begins, so does the season of Lent. During Lent we remember when Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting and praying followed by being tempted by the devil.

Most of us think that if there is one thing we know about in life, it's temptation. We face temptation all the time. Temptation hangs in the air and on surfaces like flu viruses, always threatening to break down our resistance. Like the coronavirus that we are facing now, that seems to come from out of nowhere. So too, do the temptations of life morph to the desires and needs promoted by the world. We find that we are tempted to eat and drink to excess, to flirt with somebody at work, to cheat on a test, gossip about a friend, lie our way out of trouble ... you name it. We are always being tempted to do what we know we shouldn't do. This is something that even the young experience. My three year old granddaughter looks to be sure no one is watching before she steals a piece of candy.

Tom Long tells the story of wisdom gained when he was young. "Our church school teacher told us one Sunday, 'The best measure of a person is what you would do if you knew no one would ever find out.' Recalling that remark now, our Sunday school teacher was moving toward a profound gospel insight: Christian ethics grow out of Christian identity; the decisions we make in life are a product of who we understand ourselves to be.

In that light, we have a far too shallow view of temptation. The deepest temptation is not the urge to misbehave, to do what we know we shouldn't do, but rather the enticement to compromise our baptismal identity, to be who we are not called to be."








On February 9th, we were blessed to celebrate the baptism of Bryce Rosenfeld. We all received a stone to remember our own baptism!


Buy your tickets at church! Invite your friends and family!

Per Capita Offering for 2020

Our Per Capita Offering is now being collected for 2020. Per capita is an amount of money per member (this year, \$40.00) that our congregation pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The amount not given by the members must be covered by our general budget. The total amount due is over \$4,000, last year approximately half was paid out of the operating budget, taking away from the ministry of Cornerstone.

The Per Capita Offering is one way we work together with Presbyterians from other Presbyterian churches in our presbytery and across the country. When we give our offering, it allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world. One great example of how Per Capita supports the local church ministry is through the funding of the preparation, administration, and grading of standard ordination examinations for seminary students. This is one way we help to prepare future ministers to faithfully answer their call from God. As Presbyterians, we believe that we need each other as we work together to and discern the mind of Christ for the PC (USA).

We encourage all members to pay your share of \$40.00 per member, even if it is made in small increments throughout the year. By contributing your portion of per capita, you will free up funds in our operating budget for the work of our congregation in this community. We hope you will make this contribution at your earliest convenience. Together is how we have the greatest impact!

Can you help by making a donation to provide our fellow Jackson residents with these needed items? Donations will be collected at church through Easter Sunday. Thank you!



Staying faithful when the pressure was most intense. That's what these two did. The Jewish people had reason to be depressed. Their nation had been conquered. Their hometown was in ruins. They were living in captivity. Yet from the ashes, God raised up two key figures to preserve the Jewish race. Daniel was among the first of the captives carried away by the Babylonians. Although he lived in a culture opposed to God, he was always faithful to the Lord – even in the face of death – and ultimately was able to influence kings and rulers. Esther was in exile during the time of the Persian Empire. Like Daniel, the Lord also placed her in a position to influence those in power. God also called her to step out in faith and risk her life to foil a plot against her people. As a result of

her bold actions, the entire Jewish race was saved from annihilation.

The Life Lessons with Max Lucado series brings the Bible to life in twelve lessons filled with intriguing questions, inspirational stories, and poignant reflections to take you deeper into God's Word. Each lesson includes an opening reflection, background information, an excerpt of the text (from the New International and New King James versions), exploration questions, inspirational thoughts from Max, and a closing takeaway for further reflection.


