

A Message from Reverend Pruner

Not Just Pretzels Anymore!

As we have all struggled through this last year each of us have found God, people, distractions and food to comfort us. One of the foods for me has been the pretzel. My favorite is mini pretzels by Rold Gold. Did you know pretzels actually came to life in the church. Pretzel history reaches many centuries back to a time during Lent when Italian monks would bake unleavened bread. They rolled the left-over scraps into tubes and formed them into the shape of children's arms folded across their chests in prayer. They were soft-baked as rewards for children who correctly recited their religious lessons and prayers. The monks called these treats "pretiolas," Latin for "little rewards." The 3-part shape of the pretzel was also associated with the Holy Trinity.

Now, whether crispy or soft, pretzels are firmly linked to Lent in many congregations where the early legends are repeated each year. The world's oldest sketches and descriptions of these treats are in manuscripts now stored in the Vatican Library.

During this season of Lent, as you seek ways to find comfort I encourage you to listen to the monks of old and pray. Praying brings us closer to the God who created us, Jesus who came to teach us, love us and save us and the Holy Spirit who guides and inspires us. I also encourage you to set aside time during Lent to read one of the gospels. Whether you read Matthew, Mark, Luke or John you will read of the amazing life, death and resurrection of our Lord.

May God be with us in this time of Lent as we prepare for Easter, the holiest day of the year!

What is Per Capita? How is our Per Capita offering used?

The Per Capita offering began long ago to assure that representatives from every region of the United States would be able to gather for General Assembly. Today, General Assembly gathers every other year to address important issues concerning the larger church and representatives from every Presbytery attend.

Over the years the Per Capita Offering has expanded to include the support of vital programs that help to assure strong pastoral leadership. As well as the coordination of volunteer mission work. Some of the many ways includes:

- administrating ordination exams for candidates for ministry
- administering the church leadership connection referral system helping churches seeking a new pastor.
- planning for General Assembly and other related gatherings allowing us to connect with one another and our Lord.
- partnering with ecumenical bodies worldwide to promote Christian unity and to extend the church's work for peace and justice far beyond what we can do ourselves including the World Council of Churches.
- working with volunteers worldwide

Our Per Capita Offering is received throughout the year. Per capita is the amount of money due per member (this year, \$40.00) that our Church pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The three programs supported by OGHS - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

During Lent we will be receiving our OGHS Offering, with special collections on Palm Sunday and Easter. 
